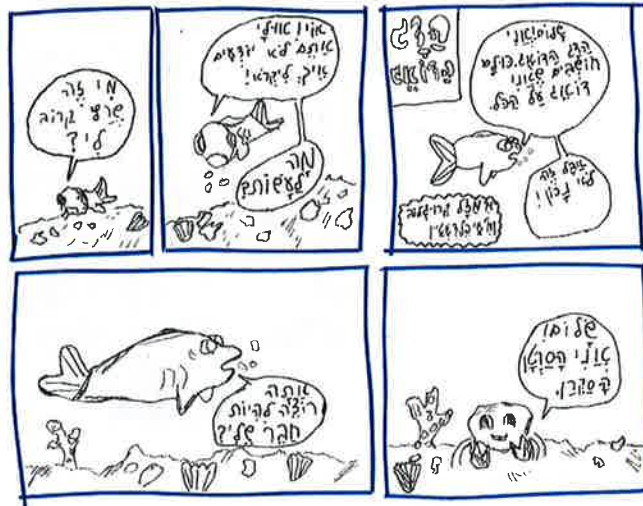
Legible means that the words are *readable*. It would even be a good idea to check with an adult to see if they can read your comic.
